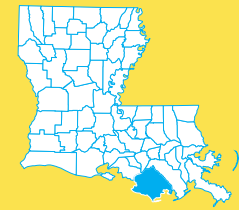


Terrebonne



Opportunities for Growth

- The teen birth rate in Terrebonne Parish was 36% higher than the statewide average in 2021.
- Just 7% of infants and toddlers from low-income families had a publicly funded early care and education seat in 2021.
- Births to Terrebonne Parish mothers who had early and adequate prenatal care decreased by 11.7 percentage points between 2011 and 2021.

Areas of Strength

- Terrebonne's child poverty rate (23%) was four percentage points lower than the statewide average in 2021.
- In 2021, 55% of public school 4th graders scored at Mastery or above in English Language Arts (ELA), the fifth-highest rate in the state.
- Terrebonne Parish's immunization rate among year-olds improved by five percentage points between 2014 and 2021.
